Master Class with LIHSA Alum Hubert Point-Du Jour

On Tuesday, October 27, 2020 LIHSA's Advanced Scene Study students had an insightful master class with Hubert Point-Du Jour. Hubie is a LIHSA alumni who graduated in 2000 and has gone on to work as a professional actor in Theatre, Film and Television since graduating from NYU. He can currently be seen in *The Good Lord Bird* on Showtime, co-starring Ethan Hawke and Daveed Diggs. Hubie is now filming a new television show called Dr. Death which will air on The Peacock network.

The students had the opportunity to ask many questions about Hubie's process as an actor. He

was asked about the difference between auditioning for Theatre verses Film or Television, and emphasized the importance of knowing all their lines by rote so that they can focus on their relationship with the camera. He told the students that the best way to play a part realistically is to personalize every character, which means to find the connection between the actor's life and the life of the character.

He reminded our students that not getting a part does not mean you are a bad actor, it is because you are not what that director is looking for at that moment. Be you, embrace who you are and where you come from. Keep working, learning, and growing as an actor and never give up.





For the past five years Jon has been directing real time virtual productions for commercial clients such as Kraft, Pepsi, Nabisco, Hershey, and Planters among many others.


Jon likes to paint and draw in his spare time, is a film and comic book geek, an avid motorcyclist, and lives on Long Island with his wife and son.
