


He is also an Emmy nominated actor for the YouTube show *Giants* which was recently picked up by BET.

New York Tenors and LIHSA's Francis Lees

LIHSA's own Francis Lees worked last weekend as Musical Director for five New York Tenor shows at the Avenel Performing Arts Center. His work musically supported the beautifully themed show for the three amazing singers: Daniel Rodriguez, the legendary singing 9/11 first responder at the Twin Towers; Christopher Macchio, who has performed as of late at the White House; and Mr. Andy Cooney, called by the NY Times. Irish America's favorite son. Each individually, are brilliant artists, but together



form a formidable trio, and their concerts are filled with stories, songs and laughter that are thrilling and entertainment.

The fans at the Avenel Performing Arts Center were wowed with Broadway standards like the *Man of La Mancha* and *The Impossible Dream;* Americana favorites like *Hallelujah* and *Scarbough Fair;* original songs such as *I won't Turn My Back on You* and *New York in My Dreams;* an English lyric version of *Nessun Dorma* (the operatic aria form Puccini's *Turandot*, made famous by Pavarotti) and *The Amazing Granada*, sung by Daniel Rodriguez.

Francis Lees was a last-minute replacement for the Tenors' Musical Director who was diagnosed with COVID the night before the first of five concerts. He was asked to fill in because Andy Cooney of the New York Tenors and Francis

Lees have a known each other since their High School days. Andy met Francis in 1979 while they both attended St. Pius X High School in Uniondale. While Francis Lees went onto graduate from St. Pius X, Andy Cooney finished his High School education at Massapequa High School. Coincidently, during Andy's time at MHS, Andy attended LIHSA (formerly known as the Cultural Arts Center), then located in Hicksville. One of Andy's educators at the time was Burt Michaels. Andy attributes his success in the music business to his exposure to the arts in LIHSA's Theatrical Department.

Andy Cooney, most known in the Irish and Celtic music scene has recorded 20 albums. He has in the last 5 years had number 1 singles in the Country Music scene in the UK and Ireland. This versatile vocalist and performer has a large fan base and has sold out Carnegie Hall 9 times.

LIHSA Students Participate LI Regional Student Forum


