




Heather is featured in the published photography book Dance Across the

Latency is one of the biggest challenges we face when we try to make music together from-a-distance, and playing together is something we miss most during this historic pandemic. Since March 2020, the Berklee Global Initiatives team has explored technology tools and platforms to identify the best options for real-time music-making in the classroom, studio, and rehearsal settings. The result is their application of Jamulus (free open-source software that is used with its own Linux Virtual Private Server Network).

Long Island Composers Alliance

The Long Island Composers Alliance (501(c)(3)) was founded in 1972 and is the only organization devoted to creating, promoting, presenting, recording and preserving the best original, contemporary music by composers living and working on Long Island. LICA has presented over 350 concerts featuring more than 1600 new compositions by over 100 Long Island based composers.

This annual celebration of young composers and performers has become one of LICA's most popular events. They are proud that "Music By and For Students" has become the model for state-wide NYSSMA student composition programs. This concert features performances of selected student compositions, as well as compositions by LICA composers, performed by student musicians. The student composers and student performers are elementary school through high school age.

Open to student composers (elementary through high school

- All music genres duration of your composition should be less than 5 minutes
- Composition should be written for: solo, duos, trios and quartets.
- This will be done as an on-line video showcase of the winning compositions.
- Submission deadline is May 25, 2021
- Videotape your performance and submit it to infolicamusic@gmail.com:
- Include your name, (email address), phone number, and age (as of June 14, 2021)
- Write "LICA Student Concert" in the subject line
- Attach a pdf of the score for your original composition
- Pay the non-refundable \$10 application fee by clicking on the "Donate" button on the LICA website <u>www.LICAmusic.org</u>
- Guidelines to follow regarding your video:
- Observe the COVID-19 six feet spacing while recording
- Wear a face mask when possible
- Wear concert dress (black top, black pants/dress, shoes (if your composition wins, your video will be posted on the internet)
- Compositions will be selected by the LICA judging committee
- You will be notified by email regarding the judging committee's decision
- \$100 cash prizes will be awarded for outstanding student compositions
- Prizewinners will have their video performance uploaded to YouTube and the LICA Facebook page
