2021/22 Tuition Incentive

School districts that did not send students during the 2020/21 school year will pay the full tuition for the first student enrolled. However, you will receive reduced tuition rates for all students once you send at least two students.

For each additional student – up to three additional, beyond the first student – the district will receive a 3% discount on all enrolled students. For example, if your district sends two students, you will receive 3% off both students' tuitions. If you increase to three students, you will receive 6% off all three students' tuitions. You can receive up to 9% off all students' tuitions by sending three or more additional students.

Base Enrollment Billing Model

In addition, to better predict enrollment, support the program and have a billing methodology more consistent with Barry Tech and GC Tech, we introduced a modified rolling-average billing model for LIHSA ("Base Enrollment") in 2020/21.

The Base Enrollment concept will help stabilize enrollment and smooth out the impact of increased enrollment for districts. The Tuition Discount provides financial relief to districts sending additional students to the program.

Letter of Intent versus Actual Enrollment

The number of students indicated on the eLOI will be the district's estimate of the number of students who are expected to attend LIHSA. However, qualification for the discounted tuitions will depend on the actual number of students enrolled each month.

As a "new sending district" you will be billed for the actual number of students enrolled monthly as described above. You will then have a Base Enrollment in the next budget year.

As a reminder, districts are always billed for all students attending LIHSA, which is different than traditional CTE where a rolling-average is used.
