Masks made by LIHSA students Emma Fletcher and Martha Chavez are on display at Silicone Epoxy Technology. This is the store that supplied our materials for the masks and one of the only places on Long Island that sell the materials used. The masks were sculpted with WED clay, molded with Ultracal, and slush casted with latex. The pieces were painted with a latex/acrylic mix that was made by the students.


