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
From the Principal's Desk for our LIHSA Families

School Transportation Issues

Many students have experienced challenges with school bus transportation this week. It's been very frustrating for families and we wanted to outline what you need to know:

 Some districts have contracted with Nassau BOCES' transportation department to bring your student to school. This is a centralized service



- through Nassau BOCES, not directly through LIHSA, and their information can be found www.nassauboces.org/transportation
- If your student doesn't arrive to school on time due to transportation issues, please contact Valerie Petrocelli as soon as possible. Students are never academically penalized due to transportation issues but we need to hear from you directly to appropriately note the absence or delay. - All concerns about school bussing should be directed to your home district's transportation office. You can find that phone number on your school district's webpage.




and drum workshops led by world-renowned instructors, arts and crafts and a selection of short films (to be enjoyed virtually), all celebrating Africa and the diaspora.
