An Art Tour of the "Low Country" with Dr. Chris Rogutsky







Important Updates on 54 Below and The Paramount

By now we are all accustomed to changes and shifts in COVID protocol. Please note these important updates put in place by <u>54 Below</u> and <u>The Paramount</u>, performance venue sites for upcoming LIHSA concerts. We encourage you to continue to monitor their updates, as we will, which is subject to change at any time before our events.

Feinstein's/54 Below:

Please note that all guidelines and policies are subject to change in accordance with government mandates and recommendations.

Effective immediately, all patrons over the age of 5 and on-stage participants of any age must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

All guests entering the club age 5* and older must provide proof of full vaccination at the door. An individual is considered fully vaccinated 2 weeks after the required dosage.

*Currently, children ages 5 to 11 are required to show proof of at least 1 vaccine dose. As of December 27, 2021, children ages 5 to 11 will be required to show proof of full vaccination.

Proof of full vaccination can be your actual card, a photo of your card, the Excelsior Pass, or proof provided by a foreign government.

Spotlight at Paramount

Through January 15th, Spotlight will require all of its patrons to show proof of full vaccination for COVID-19. Vaccine requirements after January 15th will be announced as the government continues to assess the current health crisis.

Upon entry, patrons 12 or older must provide an accepted form* of proof of full vaccination (two weeks after final dose), and matching photo ID. Children 5 - 11 years old must provide proof of at least one vaccination dose.

Accepted forms of proof of vaccination include hard copy of vaccination card, Excelsior pass, SMART Health Cards issued outside of New York State, full-course vaccination through NYC COVID Safe app, a CDC Vaccination Card, or other official immunization record. All forms of vaccination must be accompanied by a photo ID.
