





In honor of Black History month, we'll dedicate a space each week to celebrate a Black artist. This week: Billy Porter.



The NYSSMA (New York State School Music Association) Solo Music Festival will be held at Syosset High School, Syosset on May 6 & May 7, 2022 Level 5-6 Non-All-State and All-State.

All instrumentalists and vocalists are eligible to participate in the NYSSMA festival. (Students wishing to audition for All-State must be in tenth or eleventh grade) Students are given the opportunity to perform a prepared piece before

an adjudicator and receive a written evaluation and grade. For all students, these marks weigh heavily on their acceptance into next year's All-County and All-State organizations.
