Craig Cosgrove is continuing his two semester residency with our Digital Music Composing with an App Using Garageband & Voicey class. Students are learning the basic steps to writing, recording, and mixing a song in GarageBand. Voicey is an app that connects singers, songwriters, artists, and producers through solo and collaborative songwriting. Record, publish, and share. All applicants must be nominated by their high school, and applications must be submitted by a district administrator. Please note the following steps and due dates.

Students:

- 1. Starting the week of March 21, 2022 please let the referring teacher/mentor (as noted above) in your discipline know of your interest by March 25, 2022.
- 2. Submit your high school transcript (unweighted) to Ms. Stencel by March 28, 2022.
- 3. Ms. Stencel will notify you, if you meet the academic criteria. If the academic criteria is met, you will proceed to the next step.
- 4. All checklist components (application form, 500-word essay, performance/ portfolio component..), found <u>here</u>, are due by April 25,
