Regionally, he has musically directed Broadway musicals such as West Side Story, Godspell, The Lightning Thief, and Anything Goes. Additionally, he has performed with Cabaret groups and solo featured performers at Don't Tell Mama, 54 Below, and The Cinema Arts Center. Most nights Francis can be found doing what he loves—playing. He's been fortunate enough to perform with the likes of Yoron Israel, Avery Sharpe, George Cables, Craig Handy, Bill Saxton, Paul Brown, Feya Faku, Joe Ford, Charles Tolliver, Valery Ponomarev, Jesse Hameen, Wayne Escoffrey, Bill Lowe, Musig Soulchild, Doobie Powell, and several others. His original music and Big Band arrangements have been featured around the world and on the records of the New London Big Band as well as Dr. Emmett Goods album Another Level. Haneef holds a Bachelor of Music in African-American Music Study from the University of Hartford, a Master's Degree in Jazz Composition and Arranging from UMASS Amherst and will receive his Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Composition from the Hartt School in December 2024.
